sport of archery, such as Field and 3-D competitions or bowhunting. This program is planned to go live at Riverside after February, 2019. It will be used as an introduction to archery at the Saturday morning JOAD and will be the program for the new PATH FINDER group and learn about the beginning aspects of archery exemplified in the achievement awards of the Explore Archery program.

The existing archers that have acquired their 4th JOAD pin will be offered a position on the new TRAIL BLAZER group. This group will be guided to learning how to improve their shooting skills by learning NTS (National Training Form) if they wish or by using NTS form updates to improve their current form and shot execution. This program will provide knowledge to enable better performance by creating a single form that they can trust while shooting. Archers will also be taught how to manage their mental part of the game to remove or ignore distractions so they can shoot better without them.

Indoor 3-D League

Indoor 3-D archery will start Tuesday, January 15, and run for 10 consecutive weeks on Tuesday nights. Start time is 7 o'clock. Because the indoor archery range takes time to be transformed into a wilderness scene that has foam animals, trees, fences and other interesting things for 3-D archers to contend with, it will be closed to other archers on Tuesday evenings. Winter Indoor 600 League (World Archery Rules)

The Winter Indoor 600 league is based on World Archery league rules (60 arrows, inner 10 for compounds and uses timer). A practice score for average should be shot and recorded on a 600 scorecard from the small box attached to the middle range locker. Add your score up, put your name is on the card and place it back in the scorecard box behind the fresh scorecards. This league starts on January 16 at

7:00 pm with a group practice night where we will shoot the second of two scores that will be used to establish league averages. These averages will be used to make up teams.

The team league will start, and league payment is due, on January 23. It will go for 10 to 12 weeks depending on how many two-person teams we can create (plus a week for shoot-off between 1st and 2nd week winners). It will cost \$60 or \$70 per archer depending on how many weeks we go as determined on January 16, 2019. Recognition and banquet will be provided a week after the end of the league. 
